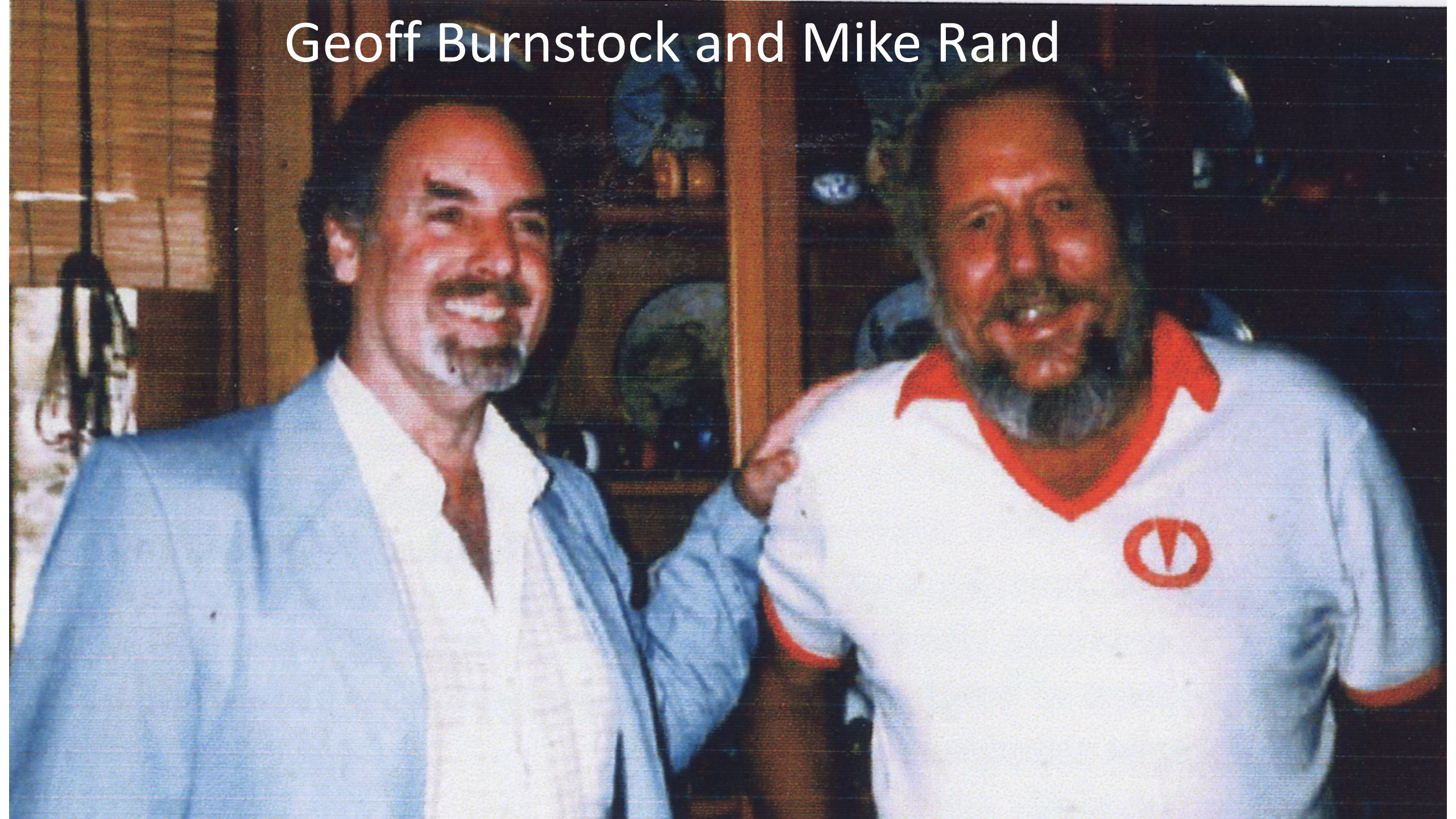

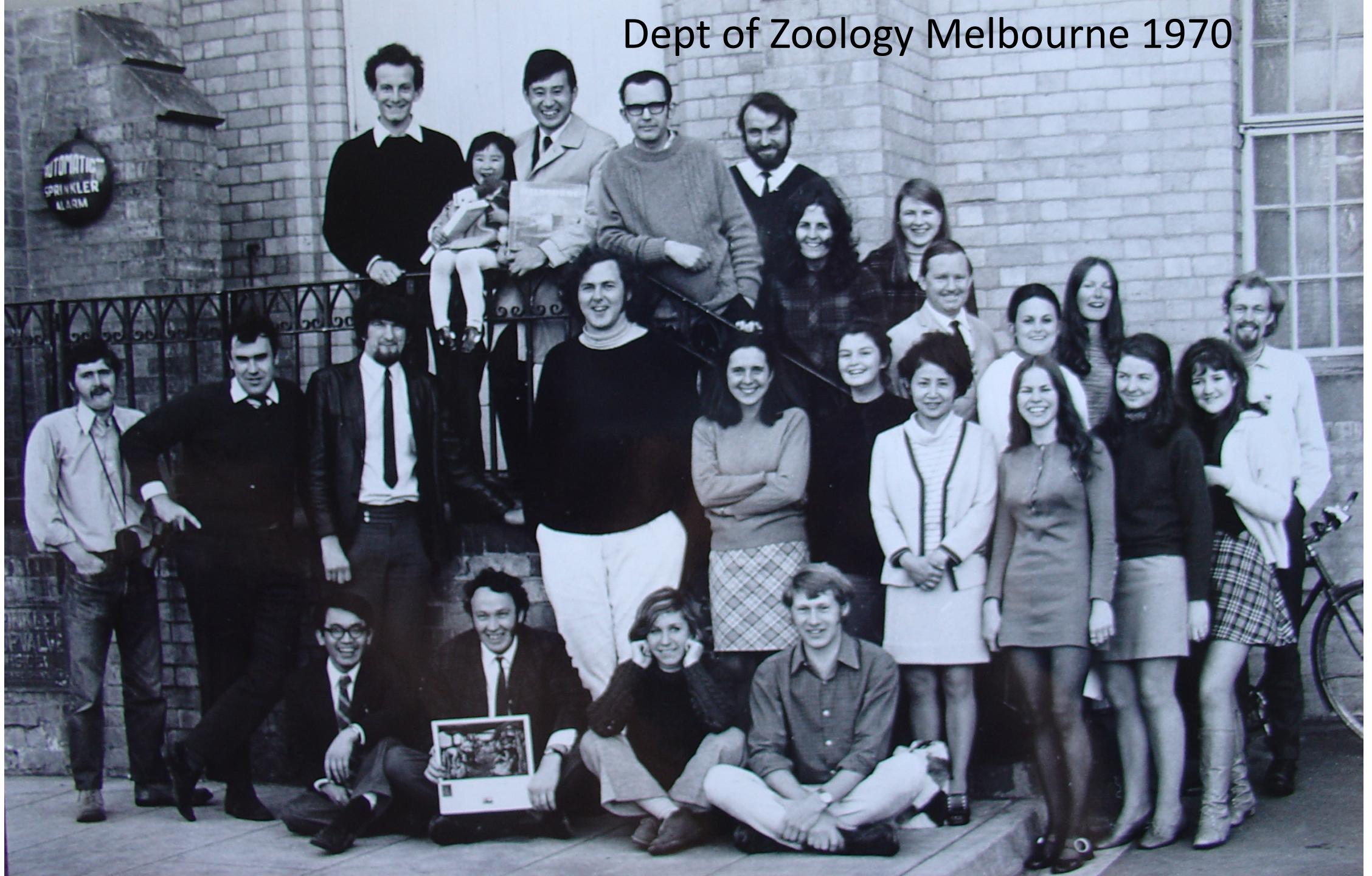

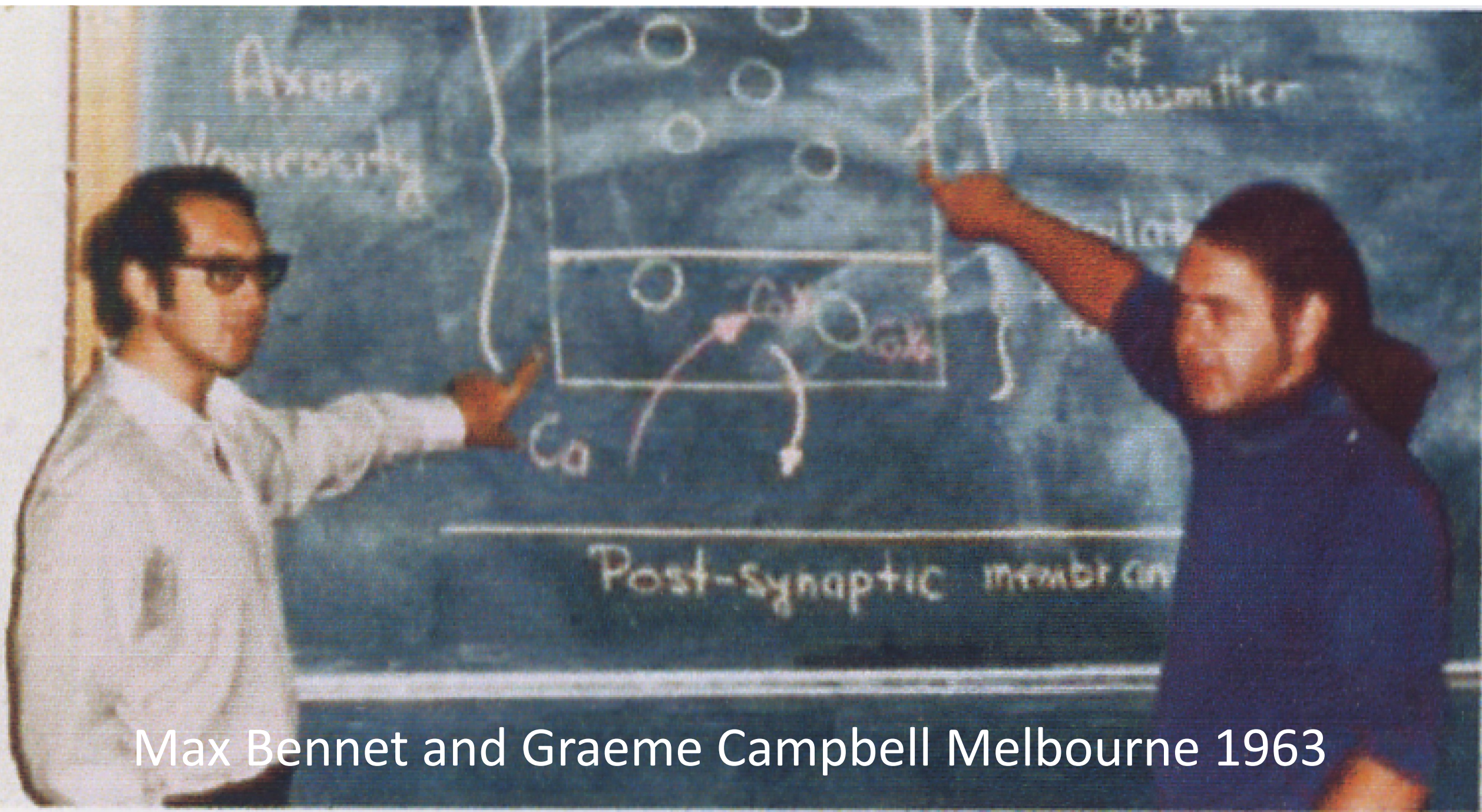


Dep of Zoology Melbourne 1972 with Geoff Burnstock Head of Department

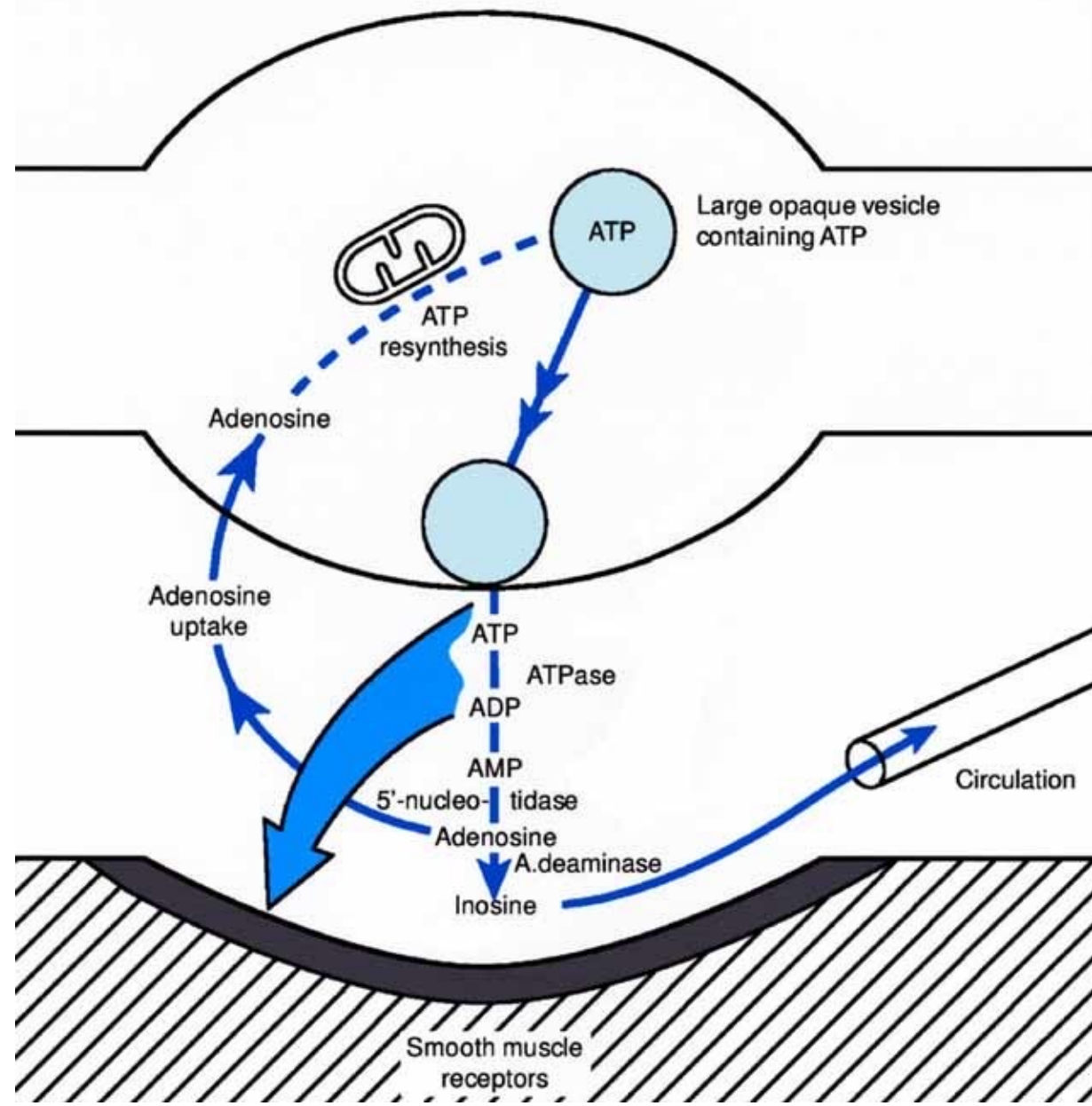


Geoff at an Argentinian "asado" Near Melbourne early 70s

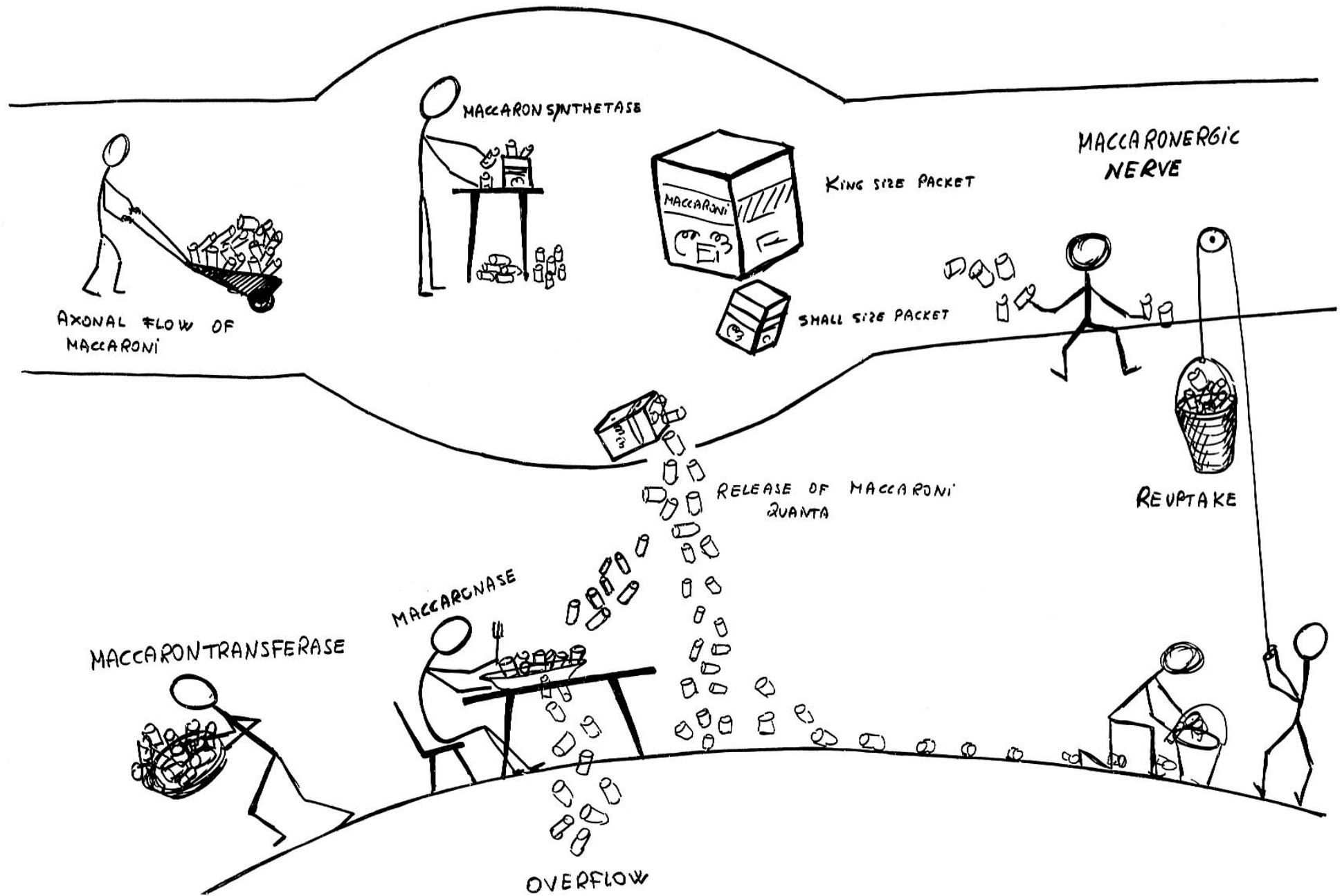

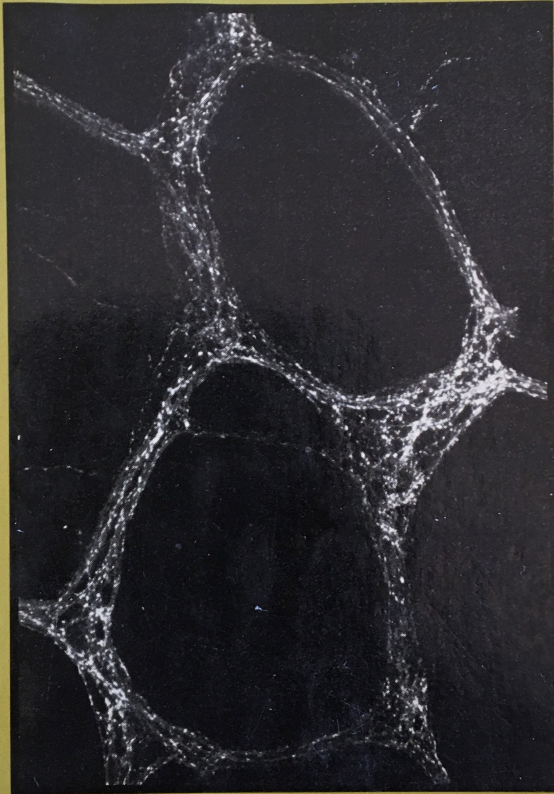

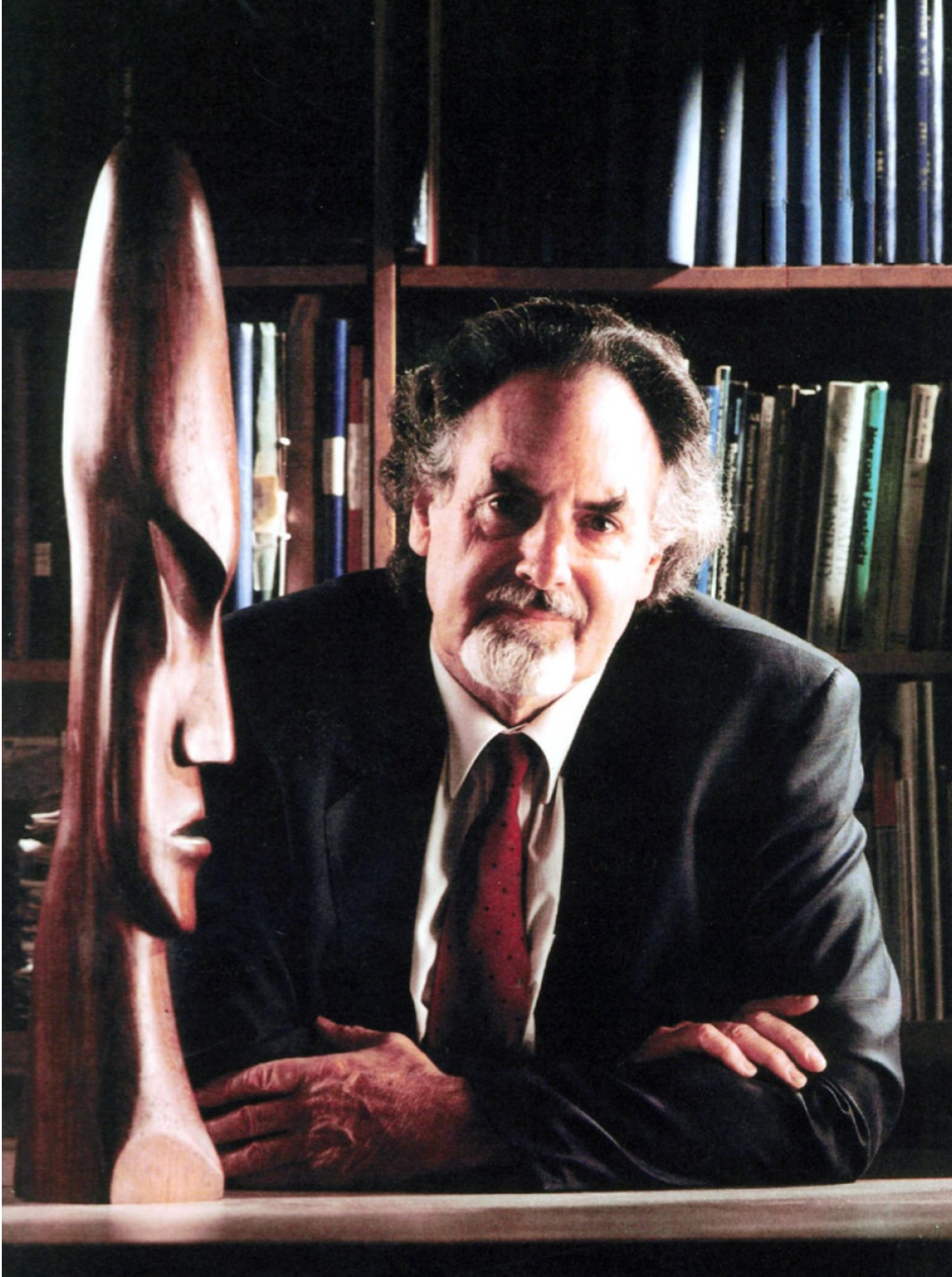

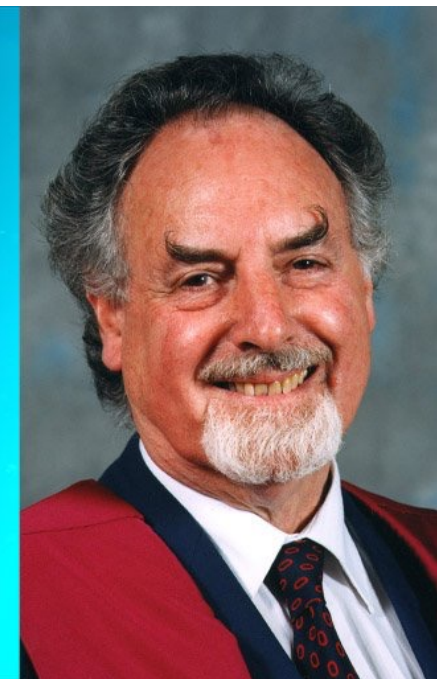
